Responsibilities:

Vision of Learning

- Works collaboratively in assessment and educational program planning with members of a multidisciplinary team.
- Demonstrates knowledge and research in the field/area of specialty.
- Facilitates the development of thinking, learning, and communication strategies.
- Works collaboratively with outside agencies and personnel, when appropriate, to assist with meeting student needs.

Learning Context and Differentiated Instruction

- Develops and implements curriculum to meet the needs of a student's individualized education plan and aligned with state standards.
- Demonstrates a thorough understanding of disabilities, and demonstrates an ability to effectively address the needs of children based on evidence-based practice.

- Participates in professional growth activities.
- Demonstrates professionalism.
- Assists students during crisis situations utilizing appropriate Crisis Prevention Intervention (CPI) techniques.
- Follows policies and procedures established by NTDSE and The IL School Code.
